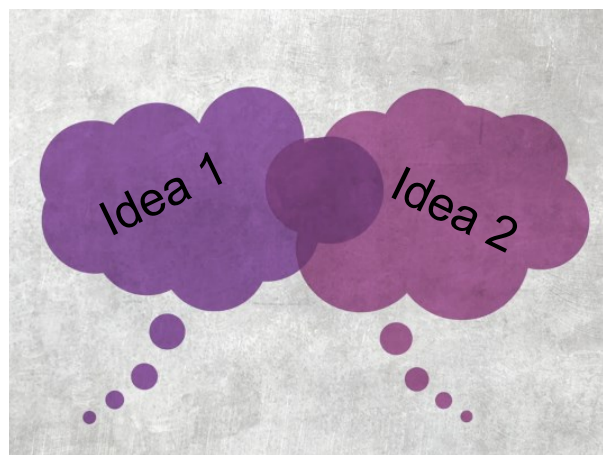

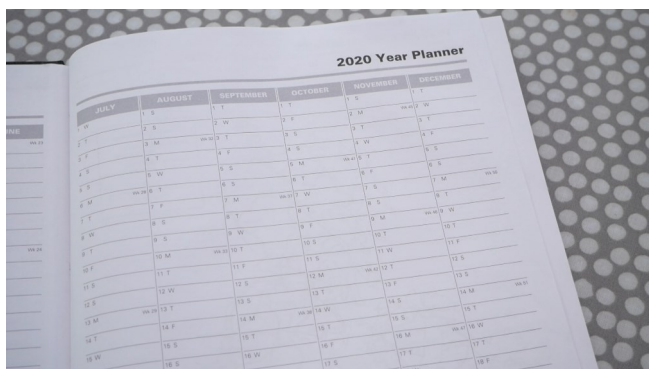

very musically inclined**



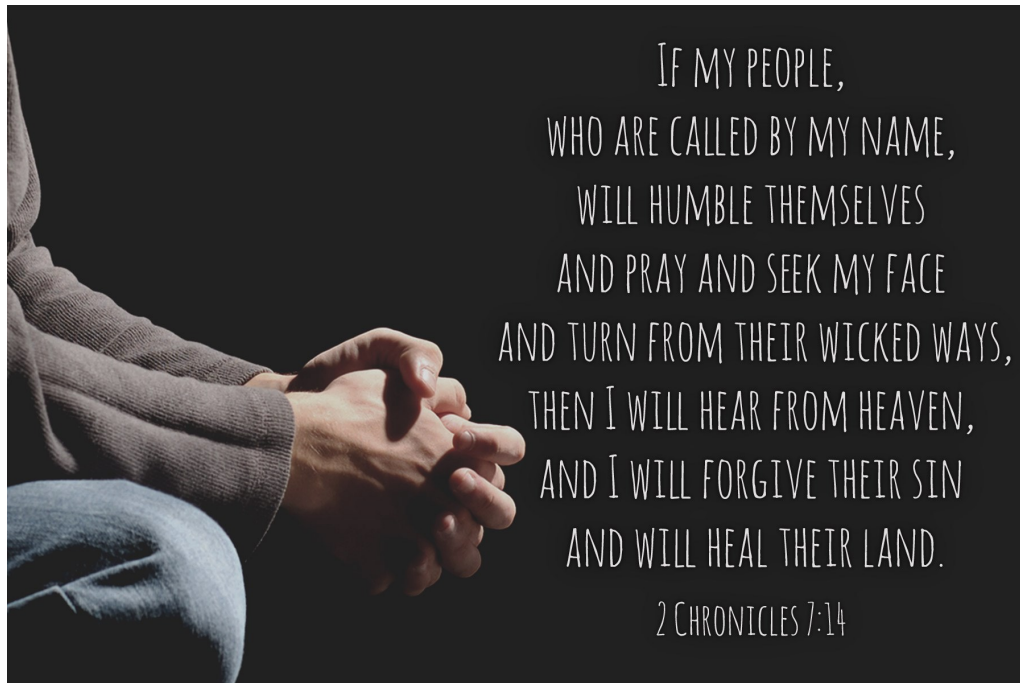
No-one is ever going to say 2020 was an easy year and that they enjoyed it – some aspects of it yes but not all of it.

But during the year I have felt that things have been happening, things that are also unseen and invisible - no it is not another nasty virus but a working of God's Spirit as churches and Christians across the country and indeed the world have become Stephen Spielberg's (he's the guy that made Star Wars and other great movies) and started to film, video, record, edit, produce and publish church services, testimonies, uplifting songs and words of encouragement.



As lockdown started I wanted to shoot a video using the words from 2 Chronicles 7:14

I would like to give a little background insight to the passage first. Solomon had just completed the building work on the first Temple in Jerusalem and was in the process of dedicating it to God. In the verses before God speaks with Solomon during the night and He affirms what Solomon had done was good. God then talks about when bad times will fall upon the people and verse 14 says



It is sad that only in times of extreme trouble do some people turn to God for help, most people these days blame Him for things that go wrong say things like “why does God allow.... to happen and this to happen”

My answer would be ask Him.

As Solomon finished dedicating the Temple of God in Jerusalem which we know today as either the first temple or Solomons Temple, which King Nebuchadnezzar burnt down, we then have the rebuilt Temple in the time of Ezra and Nehemiah which came after the exile and then the Temple in the time of Jesus which we know as Herod's Temple which was eventually destroyed in 70AD by the Romans.

The Temple as with the Tabernacle of Moses' day was the resting/dwelling place for God here on earth. And each one was dedicated to God and God came in with mighty power to rest there. On the day of Pentecost that same Spirit – the Holy Spirit fell upon people and so God's Spirit is no longer in a place but in His people.

Paul in his letters talks of our bodies being the Temple of the Holy Spirit.

**So as the temple was dedicated, turned over to God if you like let us today
the first Sunday of 2021 dedicate ourselves a fresh to Him.**

Lord of the world, we pray that Christ may reign.


Lord, for ourselves; in living power remake us,
